In the case of dispute, proof of postage of such applications may be required by the Kennel Club. Puppies under 6 months of age on the first day of the show cannot be entered for competition. On no account will entries be accepted without fees. If a dog is in the process of Registration or Transfer at the Time an entry is made, add the letters NAF or TAF as appropriate after its Name. DECLARATION I/We agree to submit to and be bound by Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in their present form or as they may be amended from time to time in relation to all canine matters with which the Kennel Club is concerned and that this entry is made upon the basis that all current single or joint registered owners of this dog(s) have authorised/consented to this entry. I/We also undertake to abide by the Regulations of this Show and not to bring to the Show any dog which has contracted or been knowingly exposed to any infectious or contagious disease during the 21 days prior to the Show, or which is suffering from a visible condition which adversely affects its health or welfare or to bring any dog which has been prepared for exhibition contrary to Kennel Club Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B). I/We agree without reservation that any Veterinary Surgeon operating on any of my/our dogs in such a way that the operation alters the natural conformation of the dog or part thereof may report such operations to the Kennel Club. I/we declare that where any alteration has been made to the natural conformation of the dog(s) the relevant permission to show has been granted by the Kennel Club. I/We further declare that I/we believe to the best of my/our knowledge that the dogs are not liable to disqualification under Kennel Club Show Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 11.
 - (a) a dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulation then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show.

Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the K.C. in their possession.

Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class.

An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club.

It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection.

The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

JUDGES CV's

STEPHEN BARDWELL

My mother and I started showing and breeding Yorkshire Terriers when I was a schoolboy in 1971 and my first Champion gained his title in 1974.

Although I have long since lost track of when I judged Yorkies for the first time, apprenticeships were quite extensive in those days and it was 1989 before I first awarded C.C's.

Having decided to swap career path from teaching to boarding kennels I came to judging breeds other than my own by way of David Cavill's judges diploma course, tutored in my case by Pamela Cross Stern. I had undertaken the course to learn about as many breeds that I hoped to look after as I could, whilst we were searching for a suitable Kennels. That course led to me presenting a talk on "movement" at a Yorkie seminar, which was picked up on by other breed clubs. Within a short time I was regularly travelling the length and breadth of the country to give talks on Conformation and Movement for all sorts of fascinating breeds at club seminars, which provided me a very steep learning curve.

It was 1994 at the Lowchen Club show that I awarded my first set of C.C's as a "non specialist". Currently I have awarded C.C's in 18 breeds within the Toy group and 3 in the Utility group, and have had the honour to judge a Championship Show Toy Group on 11 occasions.

Running a boarding kennels gave me the opportunity to become involved with a number of breeds and as well as successful show lines of Yorkies, Griffons and Schnauzers I have bred and occasionally shown Airedale, Lakeland and Norwich terriers, whilst currently my life is organised by our two Curly Coat Retrievers.

JUDI CROSS

My family have always had dogs from Papillons to Rottweilers and Doberman. Eleven years ago I was first introduced to the wonderful English Toy Terrier and I have been showing and breeding them ever since. I made my first home bred champion up last year. I am looking forward to the show in November.
