- 21 The Committee, its Officers or Servants will not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his/her servant, or to any other person whatsoever or to any animal, article or property brought to the Show or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the Showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury that may be done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought to the Showground by him, and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Committee from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of such damage or injury.
- 22 The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for the products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet with requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 23 No animal, other than an exhibit, shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance except a registered Guide Dog for the Blind or Hearing Dog for the Deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
- 24 Any owner, or exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show, within the Licensed Venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 25 **CUPS/TROPHIES:** - Are to be held until the next M.D.C.S Limited Show for which they are required and are limited to fully paid-up Members. The holders for the time being of any M.D.C.S Cup or Trophy shall give approved security to the Hon Secretary as to its safekeeping and shall deliver the same in good condition before the next show for which it is awarded.
- 26 Exhibitors and spectators who have children with them at the Show will be held personally responsible for any damage caused by them whilst at the Showground.
- 27 For cheques that are returned "Refer to Drawer" the Society will, on each occasion, reserve the right to levy a charge of £10 to cover bank and administrative costs.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- 6 Entry Fees: First entry £2.50. Each subsequent entry with the same dog £1.00.
Catalogues: £1.0 with entry, £2.00 on the day
- 7 Prize Money: BIS £10, RBIS £5, BP £5,
- 8 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11 **Best Puppy in Show** - From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in show competitions are suspended.
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six months and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
Withdrawal from Competition - Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A Puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Proviso - For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or Special Awards confined to a single breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- 12 **Best in Show**- From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in show competitions are suspended.
The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining unbeaten winning dogs following the selection of Best in Show.
Withdrawal from Competition - Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A *dog* beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Proviso- For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or Special Awards confined to a single breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- 13 Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by the previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15 It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 16 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations For The Preparation Of Dogs For Exhibition.
- 17 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 18 **Dogs In Vehicles on Hot Day - Kennel Club Show Schedule Notice Annex A**
- 19 **Not for Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 20 No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 21 **EXHIBITORS PASSES WILL NOT BE SENT.** If acknowledgment of entry is required please forward a

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class **i.e. 10 November 2017.**

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1 **Withdrawal:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of regulation 90) and 20.

2 **Transfer:-**

- If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height
- For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or Junior class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six months and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won four or more First Prizes at Open or Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not.

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL JUNIOR For dogs of seven years of age and not exceeding ten years of age on the first day of the show.

SPECIAL SENIOR For dogs of ten years of age and over on the first day of the show.

VETERAN For dogs listed in the Gundog, Hound and Terrier groups

NON SPORTING For dogs listed in the Pastoral, Toy, Utility and Working groups

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The show will open at 9.00am.
- Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
