IMPORTANT NOTICES

Dog Fouling: All exhibitors are required to clear up any fouling by their dog(s). Any violation of this regulation will be be reported to the Show Manager, who will take any action as seen necessary. Venues for dog shows are becoming more difficult to find, so we need to ensure that we keep this venue clean - please help us to achieve this. Plastic Bags will be available at the Secretary's table if you forget your own.

Children: Parents/Guardians will be held responsible for the behaviour and actions of any children in their care at all times while in the precincts of the Show.

Dogs in Cars: Remedial action, in accordance with the Kennel Club guidelines will be taken in the event of any dog found to be in a distressed state. (See Rules & Regulations - No 17)

Please Note: The Show Management reserve the right to alter and amend the Order of Judging and the Ring Number to ensure the smooth running of the Show.

Cages: Can we remind exhibitors that in accordance with Kennel Club Rules cages are not permitted around the ringside.

THE BACK ENTRANCE TO THE VENUE WILL NOT BE USED. IT IS ONLY TO BE USED IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY

Fire: it is extremely important that we keep all gangways and exits from the rings clear to allow for easy access in the event of an emergency. There are also clearly marked fire exits at this venue which we have a duty to ensure are kept free at all times. Exhibitors will be asked

to move if the committee feel they are in any way restricting access to these exits.

Prize Money: Paid in cash to the winners of the relevant classes where prize money is offered (as stated on the front of the schedule).

Stakes Classes: Entry fee is £4.50 per dog. Entry fee non-refundable if for any reason you have to withdraw from any entered class. Timing of the Stakes classes cannot be guaranteed and any delay of breed/group judging to facilitate exhibitors entered in the Stakes classes will be at the discretion of the judge and the show management.

Any Variety Not Separately Classified: Dogs (and Puppies) are NOT ELIGIBLE for entry in Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes if there are ANY classes scheduled for their breed. If there is no Puppy classes in your scheduled breed you can enter in any breed class, the puppy will then be eligible to compete for Best Puppy in Breed if they are unbeaten by another puppy in the breed. Alternatively puppies with breed classes but no puppy breed classes may be entered in AV Puppy and, if unbeaten by another puppy, can compete for Best Puppy in Group. Dogs/Puppies of breeds not scheduled at this show can enter the AVNSC classes in their group and, if unbeaten by another dog/puppy as relevant can compete for Best AVNSC Dog/Puppy in their group as relevant

Best Puppy in Group: ALL puppies which have competed and are unbeaten by another puppy exhibited at the same show are eligible to compete for Best Puppy in Group

Dogs eligible to compete for Best in Groups: ONLY unbeaten dogs declared Best of Breed or Best AVNSC in their groups are eligible to compete for Best in Group.

Veteran Class Exhibits: Dogs entered in AV Veteran classes are NOT ELIGIBLE to compete in their Group unless unbeaten and declared Best of Breed or Best AVNSC in their group. There is a competition for Best Veteran in Show following BIS & BPIS.

Soft Crates: The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the potential health & safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows and in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended at the ringside are a potential hazard particularly when occupied by large breeds., And it has been known for dogs to become distressed and move soft crates along the floor and also escape. Soft crates should only be used when there is sufficient room available and when they can be safely secured.

- 1. The Show will open at 8.15 am
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence: 9.00am
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show closes half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6. Entry Fees: Members First entry per dog £4.50; Each subsequent class with the same dog £1.50. Non-Members: First entry per dog £5.00; Each subsequent class with the same dog £1.50; Stakes classes £4.50 per class. Handling Classes £2.00 per class. Not for Competition: £1.00 per dog. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries only (must be collected by 12.00 noon). Advertisements: Full page £10.00; Half page £5.00. Membership Single £2.00; Joint £3.00 (due 1st January Annually)
- 7. Prize Money: Please see classification for details of Prize Money on offer at this show.
- 8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11. From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended.(Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)
 - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively.
 - Best Puppy in Group and subsequent puppy group placings must be selected from those puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group Winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.
- Withdrawal from Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes or Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed Classes.
- Proviso For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12. From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)
 - The dog declared BEST IN SHOW is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. **Best of Breed**. Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed must be declared from those exhibits which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be selected from which the Best of Breed must be declared, from those exhibits who have received an award. From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended.(Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) **Best of Group** and subsequent group placings must be selected from:- (a) The Best
 - of Breed winners in each Group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs. (b) The best unbeaten winning dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day. From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended.(Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) **Best in Show** must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
- Withdrawal from Other Competition Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group and Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed Classes.

Proviso For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 16. All exhibitors must be familiar with K. C. Reg. F (Annex B) Reg. for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- · Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- · When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
 Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results.
 Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

- Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
- 20. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 21. Exhibitors/handlers are responsible for clearing up and removing any loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge, or any litter whether from the car park, exercise area or any other part of the venue.
- 22. The show will be held under Kennel Club Limited Rules & Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules & Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 23. Parents/Guardians please note, well behaved children are welcome but those in charge of children will be held fully responsible for their actions any damaged caused within the environs of the show.
- 24. Owners, handlers, exhibitors or any other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must ensure at all times that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car parks and approaches.
- 25. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded to have been as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency.
- 26. Bank Charges incurred through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor concerned. Any exhibitor failing to pay entry fees and/or bank charges will be dealt with by the committee of the Kennel Club. Cheques being dishonoured will incur an additional charge of £10.00
- 27. No exhibitors will be posted. Please enclose a SAE or SA postcard with your entries if acknowledgment of entries is required.
- 28. The owner, exhibitor, handler or any other person in charge of a dog at at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, caravans, carparks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Saturday 1st December 2017. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this Regulation are:- From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended.(Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed. (2) A dog in Any Variety Veteran class. (3) As provided in Kennel Club Definitions of classes. (4) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge. (5) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed judge.
- If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
 - (1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.
 - (2) Transfer a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy, Puppy & Junior excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age,18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL YEARLING For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four months of age on the day of the show.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not. Where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not. Where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

JUNIOR/ADULT HANDLING Classes to be judged on handling, open to all dogs; the entry being restricted by the age of the handler in each class

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE •

From M5 North: Exit Junction 30. Take 3rd exit at the roundabout onto A379 Exeter/Marsh Barton for 3 miles. At 3rd roundabout take last exit onto B3123 Marsh Barton/Bad Homburg Way. Exit 1st left at next roundabout and the Livestock Centre is 200 metres on the left.

From A38 Plymouth: Exit at A379 for 1.7 miles. Take 2nd exit at the roundabout onto B3123 Bad Homburg Way. Exit 1st left at next roundabout and the Livestock Centre is 200 metres on left.

From A30 Cornwall: Exit A377 Exeter. Follow City A377 through first road junction. Turn right, signposted Marsh Barton, and follow signs to Livestock Centre.
