## JUDGES PROFILES – IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER

### **Graham Hart – GILLIEGRAE**

I have had dogs all of my life from Collies as a child through to my Setters today. I am ex Royal Navy with 11 years service then 24 years in the Fire service, retiring from the later 7 years ago. With my wife, Gill, we have been involved with showing our dogs for the last 10 years, we own Irish Setters and Irish Red and White Setters and not to forget our crazy GSP rescue boy. It was 5 years ago I decided to try my hand at judging. I'm also involved with the IRWS club committee and have also took on the mantle of Secretary for Stoke on Trent and Dist Gundog Club.

### **Gareth Lawler – ROQFOLLY**

My first attempt at showing a dog was in 1977 at a local exemption show (as they were called then)... The family pet. a Shih Tzu. I was a regular visitor to open shows from then on, but didn't get my first dog to show, an English Springer Spaniel, until 1983. Over the next few years he taught me much more than I taught him, gained his stud book number, and got me hooked. I was fortunate to be able to spend my University vacations at some of the larger spaniel kennels, and so learned much of my trade at the hands of some of the Great British breeders. To this day I emphasise the importance of good mentoring from the start. Due to university my first ESS bitch didn't arrive until 1989, first litter born in 1992, by this time I had a cocker spaniel too. The pup retained from the 1992 litter was the dam of my first champion, taking her (and my) first CC at Crufts 1998, ending the year as top ESS bitch. Since this time I have been fortunate to have bred 10 ESS champions, winning BIS at the ESSC Centenary championship show in an entry of well over 200, owning top Ess brood bitch in 2010, owning and breeding the first undocked BW ESS to gain her title, had 2 litters containing 2 champions in each, and had 4 generations of homebred champion bitches in direct line I have won res ccs with Cocker Spaniels, owned and bred Beagles, and also owned Min Schnauzers, Cavaliers, Vizslas (you may see me attempt to show one later this year) and was delighted that in my first homebred litter of Tibetan Terriers, 2 of the dog pups have won their class and Best Puppy Dog at championship show. I am a firm believer in living with different breeds teaches you so much about them.....and studying and learning about as many breeds as possible makes one a better judge of ones own breed. I have spoken at two International Springer spaniel Symposia in Stockholm 2008, and Helsinki 2014, and for some years have been very actively involved with a small team who provide education and judges training throughout the UK for Ess. I judged my first gundog group in 1998, and my first Utility group in 2005, and since that time have judged it quite a few times, along with Hound and Toy groups too. I award CCs in ESS, WSS and Cocker spaniels, have judged Labrador Retriever and Briard club open shows. I am looking forward to judging Manchester Terriers and the Utility group at Okehampton, i have judged a fair few shows in the South West and find one is always guaranteed to find some quality dogs present.

### **Hilary Male - MALENBROOK**

I have been owned by dogs since the age of 13 when I purchased my first Golden Retriever after two years of persuading my parents that I would be a responsible dog owner. I have been showing for 27 years, showing Golden Retrievers and a Flatcoated Retriever under the Malenbrook affix. In that time I have owned and bred a Show Champion in Golden Retrievers, along with many Junior Warrant winners, Show Certificate of Merits and Stud Book Dog Numbers. I also enjoy the working side of owning a gundog and have done agility in the past with one. I award CC'S in Golden Retrievers and Flatcoated Retrievers. I judge any breed in the Gundog Group at Open Show Level and am on various breed clubs B and C lists. As a Championship Show Judge I have been lucky enough to judge in several European Countries and Russia. I am on several committees, Richmond Dog Show Society (Treasurer), Guildford and District Canine Society (Secretary) and

United Retriever Club (Show Sub Committee Member) I am very much looking forward to judging your show and feel very honoured to be judging BIS.

I got my first Boxer 14 years ago as a pet, but quickly decided I needed another to show. At my very second show she won her class and that was me hooked! Only dogs of six (6) calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for entry into an YKC qualifying class. Classes for handling are decided by the handler's age. The classes are divided into three age groups:

- 6-11 years (6 years and up to, but not including 12th birthday);
- 12-17 years (12 years and up to, but not including 18th birthday);
- 18-24 years (18 years and up to, but not including 25th birthday).

Please enter the class age category you will be on the day of the qualifier. If you should move into the next age range after you have already qualified, the YKC will invite you into the correct age group at Crufts.

The method for Crufts qualification is a points based system as follows:

1st Place = 30 points; 2nd Place = 15 points; 3rd Place = 10 points.

Members will receive points per group (i.e. if they handle a bloodhound, they will get points towards the Hound group). If a member gets 30 points in any one group, they will qualify to enter a dog from that group at Crufts 2019. If a member gains 30 or more points in multiple groups, they may only compete with one dog at Crufts, but they will have the option to choose from any of the groups they have 30 or more points in. All points are reset to 0 on 1st January each year. In order to enter any YKC competition, you must be a fully paid up member at the time of entry and competition. If you enter a Crufts qualifier and you have not previously paid your membership fee then any award will be forfeited. ## RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.00 am
  2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
  3. Judging will commence: 9.00am
  4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show closes half an hour after all judging has been completed.
  5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
  6. Entry Fees: **Members** First entry per dog £4.50; Each subsequent class with the same dog £1.00. **Non-Members**: First entry per dog £5.00; Each subsequent class with the same dog £1.50; Stakes classes £3.50 per dog per class. **Handling Classes** £1.50 per class. **Not for Competition**: £1.00 per dog. **Catalogues**: £2.50 pre-paid with entries only (*must be collected by 12.00 noon*). **Advertisements**: Full page £4.00; Half page £2.00. **Membership** Single £3.00; Joint £4.00 (*due 1st January Annually*)
  7. Prize Money: Stakes classes – 171, 172 is: 1st £70, 2nd £25, 3rd £15 , 4th £10 & 5th £5  
Class 173 is: 1st £25, 2nd £15, 3rd £10, 4th £5 & 5th - £3.
  8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
  9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
  10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
  11. From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)  
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively.  
Best Puppy in Group and subsequent puppy group placings must be selected from those puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group Winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.
- Withdrawal from Competition* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes or Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed Classes.
- Proviso* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)  
The dog declared BEST IN SHOW is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. **Best of Breed**. Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed must be declared from those exhibits which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be selected from which the Best of Breed must be declared, from those exhibits who have received an award. From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) **Best of Group** and subsequent group placings must be selected from:- (a) The Best of Breed winners in each Group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs. (b) The best unbeaten winning dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day. From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) **Best in Show** must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
- Withdrawal from Other Competition* Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group and Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and

Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed Classes.

*Proviso* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with K. C. Reg. F (Annex B) Reg. for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
20. Exhibits only are permitted within the precincts of the Show.
21. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge or judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
22. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car & caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
23. The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stallholders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition (KCSR(F)).

## **SOFT CRATES**

The Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside.

We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 22nd January 2018. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this Regulation are:- From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)

(1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed. (2) A dog in Any Variety Veteran class. (3) As provided in Kennel Club Definitions of classes. (4) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge. (5) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.

(2) Transfer a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy, Puppy & Junior excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not. Where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not. Where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

**SPECIAL VETERAN** For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the Show.

**SPECIAL CHAMPION** For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial

Champion – dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

**ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED** For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

**JUNIOR/ADULT HANDLING** Classes to be judged on handling, open to all dogs; the entry being restricted by the age of the handler in each class

### ADVISORY NOTICE

**NOT FOR COMPETITION** Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed

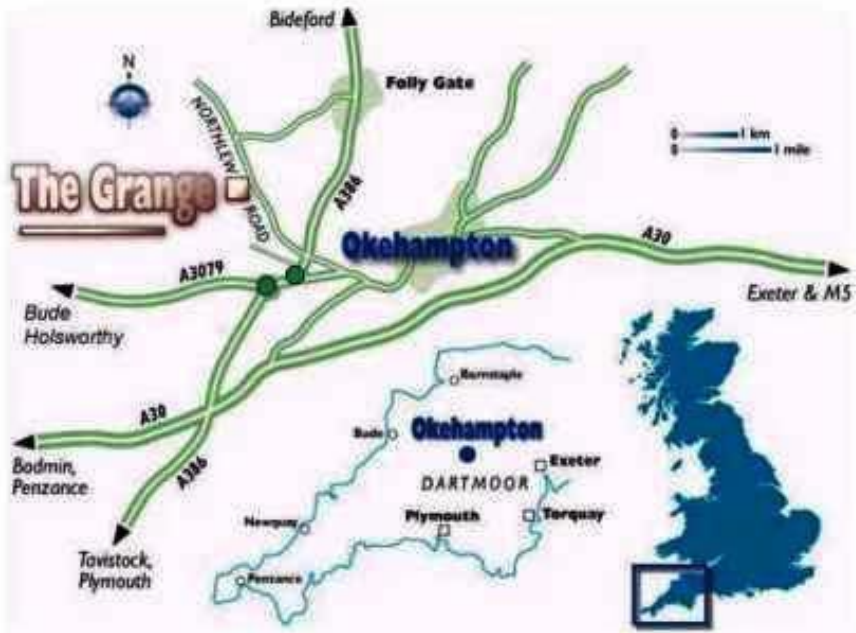
## DIRECTIONS FROM THE EAST OR NORTH:

From the M5 Junction 31 follow signs onto the A30 West, clearly signed to Okehampton/Bodmin. Continue along the dual carriageway to the exit sign-posted Okehampton (B3260), then exit the A30. At the end of the slip-road (with the BP garage on your left), turn right and drive down the hill into Okehampton. In the middle of the town you will come to traffic lights opposite the White Hartpub (on the far left). Go straight on at these lights and after one mile, at the top of the hill, turn right (sign-posted Northlew). Continue along this road for half a mile and take the right turn signposted Northlew. Continue on this road for 0.3 miles, then go straight on at the Hilltown Cross crossroads. The Grange is 1.5 miles further along this road, on the left.

## DIRECTIONS FROM THE WEST OR SOUTH:

Exit the A30 at Sourton Cross (A386 sign-posted Tavistock/Bideford) following signs to Bideford. Go past the Shell filling station and the Little Chef restaurant on your left, and follow the road for 2.1 miles until you come to a mini-roundabout (Fowley Cross). Turn right, following signs to Bideford. After 0.4 miles turn left at the mini-roundabout (sign-posted to Northlew). After a further 0.2 miles take the second left, sign-posted to Northlew. The Grange is 1.5 miles along this road, on the left. Follow Brown signs 'The Grange' from 1<sup>st</sup> roundabout

**FROM TAVISTOCK:** continue North to the A30 main junction at Sourton Cross. Go past the Shell filling station and the Little Chef restaurant on your left, from there follow the above directions
